2) This program prepares students to enter the following occupations: Emergency Management Technician (EMT) – SOC # 29-2041.00.

3) The anticipated costs for this program include the following:

a) This program will require 9 credits of college coursework and will normally take 1 semester to complete. Tuition rates and fees will depend on your legal residency: in-district, out-of-district and out-of-state. The current tuition rates and fees can be found in the online catalog:

Additional fees include:

- Facility use fee - \$12/cr hr

- Special laboratory or clinical fee – \$150.00.
- Books and supplies – \$179.50
- Technical Skills Assessment (TSA) – \$49.50 through <http://www.brainbench.com>
- Uniform – Black cargo pants, shirt, black tennis shoes or black work boots – approximately \$150.00

For example, based on the 2011-2012 catalog, an in-district student who took 9 credits during the semester would incur the following tuition, fee and other expenses:

- c) Certification or Licensure examination – Fees associated with gaining licensure are \$70 payable to MEMSA for the practical skills assessment and \$70 for the written examination through the NREMT. These fees are not required for graduation, but are required to be paid in full prior to examinations.
