## GOOD MOTORCYCLISTS AREN'T BORN, THEY'RE MADE!

### PURPOSE

The purpose of the Motorcycle Rider Program is to provide quality instruction in safe riding techniques for beginning and experienced motorcyclists. Our goal is to increase your skill level and knowledge, in an attempt to produce a safe and conscientious motorcyclists.

### BASIC RIDER COURSE (BRC) BEGINNER COURSE

The Basic Rider Course— is designed to provide a foundation of knowledge and skills for people who have never ridden, as well as those who have ridden up to 10,000 miles. Motorcycles and helmets are provided.

Non-motorcyclists can benefit from this course by learning on a first-hand basis what a motorcyclist experience and the necessity for developing respect for all vehicles on the roadway. The novice or occasional rider can benefit in the areas of skill development with emphasis for survival as a street rider.

Because the BRC course can be taken in lieu of the range-riding portion of the Department of Revenue license examination, successful completion of a written and skills evaluation is required to pass the course. Those who successfully complete the course will be issued a completion card from the Motorcycle Safety Foundation, which is recognized by many insurance companies for premium discounts.

### EXPERIENCED RIDER COURSE (ERC)

The Experienced Rider Course is intended for those who have considerable motorcycle riding experience. This course is primarily designed to increase your present skill level and develop a greater awareness of perceptual skills. Specifically trained instructors will lead you through six hours of skills practice, and discussion on the range.

The physical and psychological aspects of rider conditioning are considered, as well as special concerns, such as emergencies, adverse conditions and accident avoidance. Examples of specific course content include: higher speed steering, cornering, counterweighing, traction awareness, and braking. Other course time is devoted to motorcycle dynamics: wind effects, tire characteristics, and load distribution.

For the ERC course, you must provide your own motorcycle, helmet, and eye protection. All motorcycles must pass the student pre-ride inspection and the instructor safety inspection. Upon successful completion of the course, you will receive a discount on motorcycle insurance through select companies.

### COURSE FEES

**Beginner Class—BRC \$200**

**Experienced Class—ERC \$75**

### ELIGIBILITY

In order to register for the **BRC**, participants must:

- Be 15 1/2 years of age or older (parental consent required for 15 1/2—17 year olds).

In order to register for the **ERC**, participants must:

- Be 16 years of age (parental consent is required for 16—17 year olds).
- Possess a valid drivers license with motorcycle endorsement.
- Show evidence of current motorcycle insurance.

### PROTECTIVE CLOTHING REQUIRED

**This clothing is required  
for both courses!**

- Boots/shoes-leather preferred, high enough to cover your ankles with heels no taller than 2"; Pants-denim or other heavy material.
- Gloves-full fingered required (leather preferred)
- Long-Sleeved Jacket or Shirt-waist length of denim or other heavy material.
- Eye Protection-sunglasses or prescription lenses for your convenience.

**NOTE: THESE ITEMS MUST BE BROUGHT TO EVERY SCHEDULED CLASS PERIOD, INCLUDING THE FIRST CLASS.**
