NEOSHO, MO - The “Hermann Jaeger, Ozark Grape Hunter: Saving European Vineyards in the Late 19th Century” exhibit is open in the Longwell Museum located inside the Elsie Plaster Community Center on the Crowder College campus in Neosho through February 10. Jaeger emigrated to the U.S. from Switzerland and resided in eastern Newton County. He played a key role in helping saving Europe’s wine industry.
