

8/25/2011 - Crowder College vs. Ecclesia College (Won 8-0)

The Crowder College Roughriders opened their season with an 8-0 record setting thumping of Ecclesia College. Leading 1-0 at halftime on a Diego Araujo penalty kick, the Roughriders turned up the heat with 7 second half goals. Second half goal scorers included Kaminga, AJ Imilkowski, Joe Aubuchon, Wander Goda, Sergio Paloma and two Gabe Huerta scores in the waning minutes.

The eight goals set new Crowder records for goals scored in a match and margin of victory. It is also the first time that Crowder has won its season opener.

8/27/2011 – Crowder College vs. Northern Oklahoma (lost 1-2)

Crowder got off to a slow start, against Northern Oklahoma, giving up two 1st half goals. Scott Lennon started a Roughrider comeback with a free kick goal just before half time. The second half was very hotly contested, but neither team could manage a score.

8/30/2011 – Crowder College vs. Coffeyville (lost 0-3)

Crowder went on the road for the first time this season and was handed a resounding 3-0 loss. Coffeyville scored midway through the first half and never let up its pressure. Two goals in the first 7 minutes of the second half spelled doom for the Roughriders who were unable to get any type of possession game going.

9/05/2011 - Crowder vs. NEO (Tie 2-2 in OT)

Crowder opened the first half with two goals one from Scott Lennon and one from Jared Hill. Taking a 2-0 lead into halftime. A very spirited second half tied the game at 2-2. Guillermo Britos saved a penalty kick and the game in the second half. Two overtime periods produced little more than tempers flaring.

9/10/2011 – Crowder vs. Neosho County (Won 2-1)

Crowder started the match strong dominating possession. Weston Hanger got the first goal about 10 minutes before the break. Neosho County came back after halftime with an inspired effort and tied the score with about 25 minutes left in the game. A see saw battle ensued until Brock Smutney scored the winner on a corner kick with about 3 minutes remaining in the game. This was the first road win of the season for the Roughriders.

9/13/2011 – Crowder vs. Wentworth Military Academy (Won 7-3, Region Game)

Wentworth jumped out in front with a goal in the first five minutes and put the Roughriders under a lot of pressure. Guillermo Britos kept Crowder in the game with two excellent saves. Scott Lennon got the equalizer 13 minutes before the half and Brock Smutney gave the Riders a 2-1 halftime lead with a header from a corner kick. A Jared Hill hat trick started the second half and the Riders never looked back. Two late goals by Wander Goda and Willie DaSilva rounded out the scoring for Crowder. Bruno Maffei set a single game school record of 3 assists.

9/17/2011 – Crowder vs. Florissant Valley, St. Louis (Won 2-1, Region Game)

Scott Lennon got Crowder off to an early start with a goal in the first minute of the game on a cross from Bruno Maffei. The game was tied four minutes later while the defense was still trying to figure out how to mark. Tied at the half, the game was a back and forth affair. Eight minutes into the second half Shadrick Kaphuka scored on a goal mouth scramble and the Roughriders held on for the win.

9/22/2011 - Crowder vs. Central Baptist College (Won 4-2)

Inclement weather and a long trip contributed to the slow start for the Roughriders who found themselves behind 2-0 early in the first half. Brock Smutney started the comeback with a goal 19 minutes from the half time break and a CBC own goal left the half time score knotted at 2-2. Bruno Maffei and Wander Goda added second half goals to secure the victory. Bruno Maffei's assist on the final goal gave him six for the year and broke the single season school record for assists.

9/25/2011 – Crowder vs. East Central (Won 2-1, Region Game)

Crowder got off to a fast start with a goal from Wander Goda in the first minute of the game. East Central responded 6 minutes later. Penalty kick saves by Guillermo Britos kept the score tied at 1-1 going into half time. The second half was hotly contested, but a Brock Smutney penalty kick was the difference in the game giving Crowder a 2-1 victory.

School records were set for most consecutive wins (5) and most consecutive games without a loss (6).

9/27/2011 – Crowder vs. Independence (Won 6-0)

Scott Lennon got Crowder off on the right foot with a free kick goal in the first minute of play and the Roughriders never looked back. First half goals from Jared Hill and Franco Panto gave Crowder a 3-0 lead going into the break. Second half goals by Diego Araujo, Wander Goda and Bruno Maffei closed out the day. Guillermo Britos and Phillip Freeman shared the shutout.

The win continued the record breaking streak of consecutive wins (6) and consecutive games without a loss (7).

10/1/2011 - Crowder vs. Hesston (Won 3-1)

Crowder dominated play but gave up a breakaway goal with 10 minutes left in the first half. Franco Panto answered a minute later stripping a defender of the ball and slotting the ball through the keepers legs. The teams went to halftime tied 1-1. Panto got his second goal of the game about half way through the second half. Wander Goda added the insurance goal after a back heel pass from Bruno Maffei put him free for a shot.

The win continues the streaks with seven wins and eight games without a loss. Bruno Maffei added another goal to his record assists for a year.

10/2/2011 – Crowder vs. Cloud County (Lost 0-5)

Crowder suffered its worst defeat of the year as back to back games, a long trip and a nationally ranked team proved too much for the Roughriders. Falling behind 2-0 in the first 10 minutes of the game, Crowder continued to fight and went to the half only trailing 2-0. Initially a better effort at the start of the half was not enough to lift the Roughriders and Cloud scored three more times to finish the game.

10/5/2011 – Crowder vs. Jefferson Community College (WON 1-0, Region Game)

Jared Hill got Crowder on the scoreboard seventeen minutes into the match and goalkeeper Guillermo Britos and the back line played determined defense to shutout Jefferson College. This marked the first time in program history that Crowder Soccer has beaten a nationally ranked team.

Hill's goal was the team's 38th goal of the year which establishes a new school record for most goals scored in a season.

10/8/2011 – Crowder vs. Maple Woods (Lost 0-3, Region Game)

While dominating most of the early play, Maple Woods was unable to score until the final 5 minutes of the first half due mostly to the play of goalkeeper Guillermo Britos. A goal in the first minute of the second half and the final goal about 20 minutes later closed the door on the Roughriders giving them their first loss in the Region this year.

10/11/2011 – Crowder vs. Blue River (Lost 2-7, Region Game)

Scott Lennon and Shadrick Kaphuka got Crowder off to a 2-0 lead only to have Blue River respond with seven unanswered goals.

The two goals Crowder scored added to the goal total and the single season goal scoring record (40). Both goals were assisted and set a new school record for assists on the season (27).

10/15/2011 – Crowder vs. St. Charles (Lost 1-3, Region Game)

St. Charles scored first with about 15 minutes to play in the first half. Franco Panto responded for the Roughriders less than a minute later with an assist from Wander Goda. An own goal at the start of the second half put the Roughriders behind and a controversial goal with ten minutes left in the game sealed the win for St. Charles.

10/22/2011 – Crowder vs. St. Louis CC (WON 4-1, Region Playoff Game)

Crowder broke open a 0-0 match 10 minutes into the second half with an exceptional long range goal from Bruno Maffei. Scott Lennon, Justin Clemons and Wander Goda added goals before St. Louis CC scored in the final few minutes. Crowder moves on to a semi - final match with #1 seed Maple Woods.

The four goals and four assists continue the record setting for most goals in a season (45) and most assists in a season (32).

This marks the fourth time that Crowder has won its initial region playoff game, however the Roughriders have never gotten past the semi-finals in region play.

10/25/2011 – Crowder vs. Maple Woods (lost 3-3 shoot-out 1-3, Region Playoff Match)

Crowder got on the board early with goals by Franco Panto and Justin Clemons. Maple Woods answered with three goals of their own to make the score 3-2 at half time. Diego Araujo equaled the score four minutes into the second half and the score remained tied until the end of regulation. Two overtime periods did little to change things and Maple Woods won the shoot-out 3-1 ending the Crowder season.

New school records were established with 48 goals scored on the season and 35 assists on the season. Numerous individual records were also established.
