

## Summer 2010 Year Round Pell Policy

Crowder College will award Second Scheduled Pell Grant Awards (Year Round Pell) (YRP) for 2009-2010 using 2009-2010 ISIR data. Students will be governed by the following rules:

Beginning with the 2009-2010 academic year, students may be eligible for up to two (2) scheduled awards (200%) per year of Federal Pell Grants. For the summer of 2010, Crowder College will pay Pell Grant Awards out of the 2009-2010 award year (as a "trailer") during the transition period for the new Pell grant awards. If students use their full first scheduled award and they enroll in a minimum of 6 credit hours in the summer semester, they may receive a portion of their second scheduled award from the 2009-2010 year, providing they are otherwise eligible. If students have not used 100% of their first scheduled award, those funds will be applied to summer enrollment first. If the student is enrolled in hours beyond those covered by the residual first scheduled award AND are enrolled at least half-time, funds from the second scheduled award will be based on the total hours enrolled. For the summer 2010 only, no consideration will be given to 2010-11 student FAFSA eligibility during this cross-over payment period. Acceleration is not required in summer 2010.

To recap:

For the **first scheduled Pell Grant award**, a student must:

Be Pell Grant eligible;

Be enrolled at any enrollment status (full-time, 3/4 time, 1/2 time or less than 1/2 time);

The amounts received will count toward the aggregate lifetime limit.\*

To qualify to receive a **second scheduled Pell Grant award** within the same award year, a student must:

Remain Pell eligible;

Have received or be receiving 100% of the First Scheduled Pell Grant Award;

Be **enrolled** for summer 2010 courses on at least a half-time basis (6 credit hours) at the census date for the summer semester (the classes may begin at a later date);

The amounts received will count toward the aggregate lifetime limit.\*

A transfer student will have his or her credit or clock hours earned at a previous school or schools determined by the method described in Section 690.67 (b) (2) (ii) (A) and (B) of the Higher Education Act.

o If a student received 100% of the first Scheduled Award at their prior school, we will assume that the student completed an academic year.

o If a student received less than 100% of their first Scheduled Award, we will assume that the student completed the same ratio of the academic year (24 credit hours at Crowder College) as the percentage of the first Scheduled Award utilized at the prior school

\*Aggregate lifetime limit is defined as 900% of a scheduled Pell award. This equates to 18 semesters of full-time enrollment. This affects students who first received Pell grant payments in fall 2008 and after.
