The Health Information Technology Associate of Applied Science degree at Crowder College prepares graduates with the technical skills necessary to become a Health Information Technician. Students will become proficient in organizing and analyzing patient's health information for completeness and accuracy, coding of diagnoses and procedures, applying policies and regulations in the release and management of protected health information, applying regulatory and accreditation standards to identify and support documentation compliance, identifying areas of quality assurance/performance improvement that relate to risk management, utilization review, and documentation compliance as well as supervision of personnel. Crowder College Health Information Technology degree is accredited by the Commission on accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management education (CAHIIM).

- Manage patient health information using appropriate software
- Become proficient in coding diagnoses and procedures using current coding classification systems such as ICD and CPT
- Perform qualitative and quantitative analysis of health care data
- Demonstrate an understanding of the medico-legal aspects of patient health information

- Demonstrate an understanding of the operation and uses of an electronic health record
- Demonstrate an understanding of healthcare quality management and process improvement
