Crowder Newspaper Wins Top Awards

Neosho, MO - Crowder College's student newspaper, the Crowder Sentry, recently won best in state for the community college newspaper division in a contest co-sponsored by the Missouri Press Association and the Missouri Collegiate Media Association. The newspaper also received 2nd place for sweepstakes.

The Sentry also won a "First Place with Special Merit" rating in a national contest sponsored by the American Scholastic Press Association based in College Point, New York. In addition, the newspaper was named "Most Outstanding College Newspaper for 2014-15."
