CROWDER COLLEGE 2015 EMPLOYEE OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Neosho, MO - Three employees of Crowder College received "Employee of the Year" awards for the 2014-15 year at an end-of-year all staff luncheon today. There was one employee selected from each employee category: faculty, professional staff, and classified (support) staff. Employees were nominated by their peers and/or students and winners were selected by area Chambers of Commerce.

The **Gold Star award for faculty** went to **Latonia Bailey**, Journalism Instructor and Coordinator. Latonia was nominated based upon her dedication to her students and her profession. This year, under her direction, the Crowder College newspaper, the Sentry, received 28 awards, including Advisor of the year for Ms. Bailey, and Best Overall Newspaper. One of her nominators commented, "Ms. Bailey is an extraordinary teacher, she is hard-working, reliable, and creative in her daily teaching. She consistently goes above and beyond the call of duty in working with her students. Her leadership and instruction guide her students to success." This award is selected and presented by the Neosho Area Chamber of Commerce.

Wade was nominated based on his ability to balance hard work with joy and fun, his ability to utilize resources wisely, and to think creatively.
