Crowder College Upward Bound Programs seek to recruit innovative, enthusiastic instructors to provide hands-on guidance and instruction to college-bound high school students, grades 10-12, during the 2022 summer College Preparatory Academy. The 2022 CPA instruction will run from Wednesday, June 1 – Thursday, June 30 (18 days of instruction). This instructional opportunity will allow you to positively impact area first-generation students who lack financial resources, while also earning a generous paycheck.

## Core Instructors and Research Instructors earn \$30 per hour for up to six hours daily.

Our goal during CPA is to inspire a love of learning within our students and challenge them to think critically by providing instruction that enhances classroom academics beyond the textbook. During the summer, we ask that you focus on the more difficult concepts within your subject area and/or what students need to know to be successful in the first nine weeks of their fall courses based on the Missouri Learning Standards.

## Core Instructors for High School Curriculum

- Lower Level Math (Algebra I and II, Geometry)
- Upper Level Math (Trig, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, College Algebra)
- Literature (in-depth analysis of authors, genres, periods, and/or works)
- English (reading, writing, and speaking and listening standards for 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, or 12<sup>th</sup> grade)
- Physical Sciences (Chemistry, Physics)
- Biological Sciences (Biology I and II, A&P)
- Foreign Language (Level I, II, and Advanced)
- Electives (computer applications, engineering, STEM, ACT prep, Art, etc.)

#### Research Instructors

Research courses integrate instruction, laboratory work, and hands-on experiences in a variety of subjects and emphasize data collection and scientific methods, critical thinking, problem-solving, and career exploration. Students, led by instructors, present findings in a public forum at the conclusion of CPA. Research courses should be rigorous, hands-on, and encourage critical thinking...and fun for both instructors and students. All proposals will be considered. Research instructors may teach two different research classes.

<sup>\*</sup>Please note that we will be offering dual enrollment courses to rising 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students. Instructors must already be approved through the Crowder College Dual Credit/Enrollment program to teach the dual enrollment courses.



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Some research course proposals suggested by students and staff include weather/meteorology, robotics/drones, construction/engineering, performing/creative art, health care careers, marketing, Shark Tank/practical inventions, court case review/debate, culinary, journalism, agriculture, and politics/elections processes.
